Hand rearing and infant care of wild animal course

To hand rear and rehabilitate a wild animal means to return an animal back into its natural habitat in such a condition that the animal can initially survive the elements and, secondly, effectively re-enter the social hierarchy. The ultimate objective, in successful rehabilitation, is for that individual animal to breed and pass its genes into the wild population.

Nursing, care and managing these animals requires intimate knowledge of the requirements (nutrition) and habits of the various species, as well as an understanding and ability to adapt those requirements to a captive and compromised condition.

The care, nursing and hand rearing of an animal are therefore a process, which has various important stages that one has to be aware of.

Birds, antelope, cats, primate, rodents, rhino and elephant are just some of the species that will be discussed.
